Student Placement

The time for next year's class placement is fast approaching. If you are considering making a suggestion for teacher placement for your child, remember to use the *application form* that is available on our website (www.osmond.lcsd2.org) or in the office. Please consider the following:

- Every classroom in each grade level offers the same exposure to the curriculum.
- When classroom assignments are made for the following year, it involves a time intensive process to make sure students are considered individually for how they will succeed based on teaching style, learning style, interaction with peers in the classroom, student strengths, and teacher strengths.
- We cannot consider more than one request per student.
- Parent input is one determining factor and **not the** determining factor in placement. While we work hard to consider parent input, placement from parent input is not guaranteed. The above listed factors are taken into account when it comes to placing all students in classrooms.
- Parent input is due in the office by the end of the school day on *April 30*, 2019. Any requests received after that date, including requests made once the class lists have been posted, will not be considered.

State Testing

WY-TOPP stands for **Wyoming's Test of Proficiency** and Progress. The window for these standardized tests opens on April 15 and ends on May 9. Our teachers are coming up with a testing schedule for their class. By combining our efforts we will be able to make this a positive and productive time.

Accelerated Reader Honors Program

The Accelerated Reader program at Osmond Elementary is one of the many tools that we use to help build strong, life-long readers. In addition to celebrating individual reading success, we have an Honors Reader program to recognize those students who achieve an extremely high level of excellence. According to our librarian, Shelley Hunsaker, "The Accelerated Reader Honors program is a very challenging as well as a rewarding experience for many of our students."

Students who choose to work towards their Honors Reader certification must meet the following criteria.

- -4th grade, 150 AR points and 7.5 of those points must be nonfiction titles.
- -5th grade, 200 AR points and 10 of those points must be nonfiction titles.
- -6th grade, 250 AR points and 12.5 of those points must be nonfiction titles.

We have several students who are just points away from earning their 1st, 2nd and even their 3rd Honors certification. The following students have earned their Honors certification at this time.
