Cougar Chronicle September 2024

This year all of Osmond teachers are doing something new and exciting with our CHARACTER EDUCATION curriculum! Every week, teachers will use videos, articles, and games to teach their students about their brains so that they have better understanding about themselves, are better equipped to control their emotions and behavior, are more assertive and resilient, and have greater ability to understand and get along with others.


In the month of September, teachers will introduce the main parts of the brain and nervous system and how they function in students' lives, whether it's in learning academics, in gaining strategies in self-regulation, or in experiencing healthier relationships. Students will learn about the prefrontal cortex, the thinking part of the brain that does many important things, including makes decisions, solves problems, controls emotions and behavior, and has empathy for others. They will learn about the amygdala, the emotion center of the brain that keeps us safe by warning us of possible danger. However, it sometimes activates even when we are not in danger, such as speaking in front of others or taking a test. The hippocampus stores and retrieves our memories, so it is so important in learning and doesn't work as well without enough sleep. The students will learn a concrete representation of their brain—a "hand model" of the brain—as a way for kids to understand relationship between these brain parts, why they might "flip their lid" and how it affects their ability to think and learn when their prefrontal cortex is "offline."

Each month the newsletter will inform you what your student is learning about their brains and how it will build their character and increase their resilience!
