Osmond Elementary's school-wide Title 1 program.

Any student enrolled at Osmond, who needs extra academic help, is eligible for assistance. All students at Osmond complete a universal screener (AIMS web plus) in reading three times per year. These test results along with teacher recommendations are used to identify students needing supplemental instruction.

Schools qualify for Title 1 services based on the percentage of enrolled students in economic need. This qualification is based on the number of students in the free and reduced-price lunch program.

Here at Osmond Elementary, we use the majority of our funds for our Title 1 paraprofessional team. With this team, we are able to offer small instructional groups to meet the needs of our students.

Our Title 1 program offers after school tutoring called Smarty Club, this is on Tuesday and Wednesday from 2:35-3:15. If you have any questions, contact Ileene Jensen at Osmond Elementary.

Character Education

In October, Osmond's students will continue to gain more understanding of the three areas of the brain described in last month's newsletter.

They will learn that the prefrontal cortex (PFC) is "where we do life (cognitive, emotional, behavioral functioning)" as it is where our higher order executive functions, like decision making, problem solving, attentional control, emotional self-regulation, and control of our behavior reside.

They will learn how memories and learning are stored and retrieved with their hippocampus.

They will learn more about their amygdala being the alarm center of the brain and how it is connected to both the hippocampus and the prefrontal cortex.

Finally, the students will begin to explore the superpower of their autonomic nervous system (ANS) as it keeps us safe through neuroception, the automatic process of how we take in information from our environments. It is our ANS's "smoke detector" and our reactions of "fight" or "flight" occurs when our neuroception senses danger. For our students, that "danger" is usually in the

OCTOBER is National Dental Hygiene Month.

Halloween and fall celebrations can mean candy in abundance! Sweets and treats can be a lot of fun on special days, but having good dental hygiene is important. Here are some tips to keep those pearly whites strong & those gums healthy!

- 1. Brush 2x/day, replace your toothbrush every 3 months.
- 2. Switch to a soft-bristled toothbrush.
- Floss once a day, it's best to floss before bedtime to remove any food particles.
- 4. Get regular cleanings, every 6 months.
- 5. Eat a tooth-healthy diet with lots of veggies and foods that are rich in calcium to support healthy teeth & bones.
- 6. Delay brushing for 30-60 min after eating acidic foods like citrus fruits or tomatoes.
- 7. Avoid sticky, starchy, sugary foods.
- 8. Skip the juice and soda, go for water or milk instead.
